A Natural Wonder Like No Other: The Amazon Forest is the largest tropical rainforest in the world and one of Earth's greatest natural treasures. Covering more than 5.5 million square kilometres, it stretches across nine South American countries, with nearly 60% of it located in Brazil. Often referred to as the "Green Heart of the Planet," the Amazon is a vital ecosystem that supports millions of living organisms and plays a key role in maintaining the Earth's climate. Its vast expanse of dense forests, winding rivers and incredible biodiversity makes it one of the most fascinating places on Earth.

A PARADISE OF PLANTS AND ANIMALS

The Amazon is home to an extraordinary variety of life. Scientists estimate that it contains nearly 10% of all known plant and animal species on Earth. The rainforest is home to over 40,000 plant species, more than 1,300 bird species, 430 mammal species, 3,000 freshwater fish species and millions of insects. Some of its most famous inhabitants include the jaguar, sloth, giant anaconda, pink river dolphin, toucan, macaw, capybara and poison dart frog. Many species found in the Amazon cannot be seen anywhere else in the world. Every year, researchers discover new plants, insects and animals, showing that the forest still holds many secrets waiting to be uncovered.

THE MIGHTY AMAZON RIVER

Flowing through the rainforest is the mighty Amazon

River, the largest river in the world by volume of water. It has thousands of tributaries that provide fresh water to millions of people and countless species of wildlife. During the rainy season, large parts of the forest become flooded, creating unique ecosystems where fish swim among trees and animals adapt to changing water levels. This natural flooding enriches the soil and helps maintain the health of the rainforest.

THE AMAZON'S ROLE IN PROTECTING THE EARTH

The Amazon Forest is one of the world's most important climate regulators. Its millions of trees absorb enormous amounts of carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, helping to reduce the effects of global warming. The forest also releases vast amounts of water vapour into the air, influencing rainfall patterns across South America and beyond. This makes the Amazon essential not only for the countries it covers but for the health of the entire planet.

HOME TO INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

The Amazon is home to millions of people, including hundreds of Indigenous communities who have lived there for thousands of years. These communities have developed deep knowledge of the forest and use its resources responsibly without harming nature. Their understanding of medicinal plants, wildlife and sustainable living has helped scientists learn more about the rainforest. Protecting Indigenous cultures is closely connected to protecting the Amazon itself.

THREATS TO THE RAINFOREST

Despite its importance, the Amazon faces many serious threats. Deforestation caused by logging, agriculture, cattle ranching, mining and road construction continues to destroy large areas of the forest. Forest fires and climate change further increase the damage. As trees disappear, animals lose their habitats, biodiversity declines and more carbon dioxide is released into the atmosphere. These changes affect weather patterns and contribute to global climate change.

HOW WE CAN HELP SAVE THE AMAZON

Protecting the Amazon requires global cooperation. Governments, conservation organisations and local communities are working to preserve the rainforest through protected reserves, reforestation projects and sustainable development. Individuals can also make a difference by planting trees, reducing waste, recycling, supporting eco-friendly products and spreading awareness about rainforest conservation. Small actions taken by millions of people can have a lasting impact.

The Amazon Forest is much more than a collection of trees. It is a living, breathing ecosystem that supports countless species, provides valuable natural resources and helps maintain the balance of our planet. Its beauty, mystery and importance remind us that nature is one of humanity's greatest gifts. 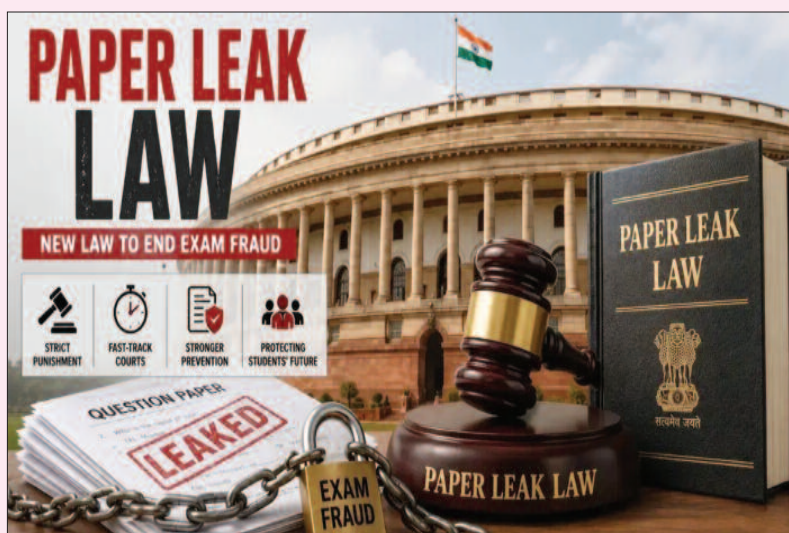

PARLIAMENT PASSES ANTI-PAPER LEAK BILL TO STRENGTHEN EXAMINATION SECURITY

The Indian Parliament has passed the Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Amendment Bill, 2026, introducing stricter measures to prevent question paper leaks and examination malpractice. The legislation was approved by both Houses after extensive discussions on the need to restore public confidence in competitive examinations. The amended law provides for enhanced penalties, including higher fines and longer prison terms for individuals or organisations involved in leaking examination papers or manipulating recruitment processes. It also grants investigating agencies stronger powers to identify and prosecute those responsible for organised exam fraud. The move comes after several high-profile examination irregularities in recent years that affected thousands of students across the country. Education experts believe the legislation will strengthen the credibility of national-level recruitment and entrance examinations. Government officials stated that technology-driven monitoring systems and improved coordination between examination authorities and law enforcement agencies will further enhance transparency.



INDIAN WEIGHTLIFTER LOVEPREET SINGH WINS COMMONWEALTH GAMES SILVER

India celebrated another sporting success after weightlifter Lovepreet Singh secured a silver medal at the Commonwealth Games. His impressive performance added to India's growing medal tally and showcased the country's continued strength in international weightlifting competitions. Competing against some of the best athletes from across the Commonwealth, Lovepreet delivered consistent lifts in both the snatch and clean & jerk categories. His determination, technical excellence and composure under pressure earned praise from coaches, sports officials and fans. Indian sports authorities congratulated the athlete, describing the medal as a reflection of years of disciplined training and dedication.

ASSAM FLOOD SITUATION REMAINS SERIOUS AS THOUSANDS CONTINUE RELIEF EFFORTS
